Organic vegetables are grown for lower-income people and distributed through local LI food kitchens. This Interfaith project with our sister church, Bethel AME, and other local faith groups, also encompasses the preservation of open space and preserving an important piece of local black history. (Hobbs Farm is a 13-acre historically black owned farm just a few miles down the road from UUFSB.) **If you donate by check, please write either "pledge" or "social justice" or "share equally" (50% UUFSB/50% social betterment) in the memo line.** Thank you.
